

VACCINATION NOTICE

(Issued July 13, 2021)

VACCINATION REQUIREMENT FOR FUTURE IN-PERSON CLUB MEETINGS

Hi Everyone,

After 16 months of almost no in-person Club activities, Port Perry PROBUS Club is looking forward to re-starting its in-person membership meetings, interest groups and various social events. We're hoping to have a membership meeting at Hope Church in September if provincial COVID-19 regulations and Hope Church permit it. And social events and interest groups should at least see the beginning of their in-person activities starting later this month.

However, we want to keep our Club members and guests safe since COVID-19 is still quite active out there in the community. As you know, the Club has a "full vaccination" policy in effect. To ensure this policy works as intended and members have confidence in it, we'll be requiring "proof of full vaccination" in order for any member or guest to attend any in-person Club meeting, event or interest group.

Adequate proof of full COVID-19 vaccination will be considered to be any official document issued to a fully vaccinated person upon completion of their final vaccination by a legitimate health care provider, clinic or pharmacy. The type of vaccine must be one of those approved by Health Canada.

The documentation must state the attendee's name, type of vaccine administered and date of when the full vaccination was completed (i.e. two doses of any of Pfizer, Moderna or AstraZeneca vaccines or a mix of them or one dose of the Johnson & Johnson vaccine). To be valid for attending any Club function, the full vaccination status must have occurred at least 14 days before the member or guest attends the function.

To keep the proof of vaccination process as simple and efficient as we can, the documentation can be provided to the Club by means of any of the following four methods:

1.) Post (mail) a copy of the proof of full vaccination document to the Club's Management Committee member-at-large:

- 2.) Email a jpg (photo) or PDF of the document to: vaccine.portperryprobus@gmail.com
- 3.) Use an online video chat/meeting app for phone or computer (e.g. Zoom, Facetime, Google Meet/Duo, WhatsApp, Micro soft Teams, etc.) that uses a camera. Simply email: vaccine.portperryprobus@gmail.com indicating an interest to use the online method, and a Club Management Committee representative will contact you to set up a mutually convenient time. It only takes a few seconds to hold the document up to the camera for inspection and it's done.
- 4.) Show the document to an authorized Club representative at any monthly in-person membership meeting.

Any proof of vaccination document submitted by email or post to the Club will be immediately deleted (email) or destroyed (post) by the Club's recipient once the document is inspected and approved. In the case of such proof submitted at in-person membership meetings or by online app with camera, there will be no physical document in the possession of the Club that needs to be destroyed since it is only viewed briefly at the time of presentation and remains in the hands of the member.

Proof of vaccination approval will not be conducted at most interest group meetings and social events, so please obtain the approval ahead of attending such an activity.

An appropriate sticker, designed for the Club, will be provided to each Club member who has had their proof of full vaccination approved by the Club. This sticker should be affixed to the PROBUS club name badge for that member. Such stickers will be considered proof of vaccination for members attending any in-person Club events/meetings. The Club will also maintain a list of all those so approved so we don't have to ask for such proof from those individuals attending future Club activities.

Please also be aware that, at least for the foreseeable future, names of all attendees at Club in-person activities (e.g. membership meetings, social events and interest group meetings) will be recorded for the purpose of COVID-19 contact tracing if later needed.

Please let us know if you have any questions or need assistance in any way in providing the proof of vaccination.

The Club's Management Committee thanks you for your cooperation in this important COVID-19 safety precaution.

COVID-19 VACCINATION RECORD

The Ontario COVID-19 vaccine booking portal offers an option for residents to download a PDF copy of their vaccination records.

The record could be useful for people who need to prove their immunized status for travel or other purposes.

The record is the same receipt that individuals received at the clinic where they got their shot — and the downloadable version could be handy for anyone who misplaced their original copy.

This downloadable PDF is a handy way for Ontarians to confirm that they've been vaccinated.

IN-PERSON MEMBERSHIP MEETING IN SEPTEMBER

START TO GET READY!!

We're planning our first in-person membership meeting in nineteen months in SEPTEMBER.

This will be a big milestone for the Club, and something most of our members have been eagerly awaiting.

Of course this assumes that the provincial regulations and Hope Church will allow the meeting which, at this time, seems well within reason. And this meeting will be a hybrid one in that it will also be broadcast live on zoom, and in addition recorded for those who can't make it to the meeting.

Due to COVID, this first meeting will have a lot of differences from our past in-person membership meetings. In addition to requiring full COVID vaccination for all meeting attendees, we'll have in place a number of other COVID-related safety precautions like:

- Partial (and some full) social distancing in seating
- Less seating available (due to social distancing)
- Possibly pre-meeting registration (due to less seating)
- Sanitizing of commonly touched surfaces
- · Possibly mandatory masking
- Plenty of hand sanitizer throughout the Church
- Social distancing markers where people line up
- Ushers to help avoid crowding in lines and in meeting areas
- No interest group and social event tables
- No 50/50 draw (we'll use the online draw instead)
- · No food or beverage service
- Limited seating in the break room

Find & bring your PROBUS name badge!!!

For those who are planning on attending in person, it's critical that you bring your Club-issued name badge. If you have provided proof of vaccination to the Club for approval, you'll get a sticker (designating that approval) that will be put on your name badge by an authorized Club representative. For most of you, getting that sticker will probably happen just before you enter the church for the meeting. But to actually get into the church, you'll need to have your badge with that sticker. We'll also be recording the names of all attendees for future COVID contact tracing if required.

But the key is to have your name badge. And if for some reason you can't find it, please contact our Membership Chair, Linda Parry, at portperryprobus@gmail.com

Obviously given how quickly the COVID risks change, not to mention the related provincial regulations and public health advice, our plans for the September meeting remain a bit preliminary at this time. But as things firm up, we'll keep you informed all along the way by email, newsletter and website. So stay tuned. And now's the time to start searching for that name badge.



DIGITAL COMMUNICATION TIPS



We will be providing a monthly series of tips on using your tablet and computer.

Here is the fifth article

ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE (AI)

What is Artificial Intelligence? Simply, it is the simulation of human, or natural, intelligence with a computer. It is a machine that thinks like us and mimics our actions; recognizing our speech, problem solving and planning. And a huge part of AI is the computer's ability to learn. Before AI, a computer could only do what it was programmed to do. Now it can take the knowledge it has been given, and learn how to do new things, well beyond its original programming!

Some examples you see every day are the algorithms used by Google, such as their Magic Sauce that is used to determine if an email is important to you, or to assist you in finishing a phrase or sentence in an email.

Another example is self-driving cars. The car "sees" the lines of the road and knows to stay within them.

And if you have ever had a "conversation" with a computer when you have called in to a customer service department, then you have encountered Artificial Intelligence.

AI doesn't always go as planned which certainly isn't surprising when you're expecting a computer to act like a human. One of my kids was part of the project to get AI going for the customer service line of a major airline. The chatbot, named Juliet, misunderstood the praise being provided and responded with a Suicide Hotline:

"Shout out to the crew member on my flight today ... who helped me take care of a plant cutting by breaking out her own duct tape and helping me make a protective case to get a new succulent home," she wrote to the chatbot.

"We take these comments very seriously," responded Juliet. "If you're having these thoughts, please reach out to the Canada Association for Suicide Prevention, You can find your local hotline at https://suicideprevention.ca/. In emergency, please call 911."

While AI enhances the speed, precision and effectiveness of stuff we do, like emailing and banking and driving and booking flights, is Artificial Intelligence generally a good thing?

Do you remember the computer named HAL from 2001: A Space Odyssey? The film was made way back in 1968 but was prescient in its portrayal of a computer, loaded with what we now call AI, that goes rogue. When HAL begins to malfunction and is faced with the prospect of disconnection, HAL decides to kill the astronauts in order to protect and continue his programmed directives – to stay "alive".

Quoting a Vox article on the renowned scientist Stephen Hawking's views on AI, "It will either be the best thing that's ever happened to us, or it will be the worst thing. If we're not careful, it very well may be the last thing."

Not just Stephen Hawking, but Elon Musk and Steve Wozniak and Bill Gates and many others have expressed their concerns about AI. What happens when the computers become smarter than us? What happens when the computer goes rogue like HAL? Or what happens when the creator of the computer is intent on destroying rather than enhancing the human experience?





Polychromatic Woodturner

Peter is a polychromatic, segmented wood-turner, designing and making wooden bowls of all sizes and shapes, containers with lids, cutting and charcuterie boards, and beautiful segmented rolling pins. During his working years in the Boston, Massachusetts area, Peter worked in several wood shops before starting his own business as a small general contractor, which he managed for almost 30 years. His experience includes cabinet making, designing and building spiral and circular stairs, building furniture, and of course, carpentry, roofing and painting in the construction industry.`

As he approached retirement, he started turning wood on a lathe and greatly enjoyed the challenges and the almost limitless possibilities that segmented woodturning provided. Segmenting is starting with a board and carefully and meticulously cutting it into small pieces and gluing the pieces together to form the desired size and shape and then turning the piece on a wood lathe to achieve the final appearance. Relying on exact cutting, Peter uses very little fillers and completes all of his pieces with food safe oil and wax finishes. With work on display in Canada and the US, Peter is a resident artist at Scugog Council for the Arts in Port Perry.

Peter and Marilyn, his wife of almost 54 years, immigrated to Canada 13 years ago to be a bigger part of their grandchildrens' lives. Peter and Marilyn are now Canadian citizens.
